



# BEHIND THE DESIGN OF HERITAGE COMMUNITY'S RENOVATIONS

Heritage Community has been a leader in senior living in Southwest Michigan since 1945. The independently operated not-for-profit community has evolved over the years to meet the changing needs of seniors. Like other iterations of the past, the latest wave of renovations sweeping across campus will reflect Kalamazoo's unique local culture, while continuing to set the tone for innovation.

With Chicago-based designer Perkins Eastman at the helm, Heritage Community embarked on the renovation of its main dining venue and its wellness center in September. Senior living and healthcare design have been at the cutting edge of the esteemed, global architecture firm's success since it was founded four decades ago in Manhattan, where it is headquartered. The firm is often consulted by manufactures to come up with new products, furniture lines, and textile collections.

Besides having their finger on the pulse of the newest design trends and materials, Perkins Eastman looks for an equilibrium among the hospitality, healthcare, and residential aspects of senior living design. "We are always reminded that this is someone's home," says Jen McDermott, associate principal at Perkins Eastman. "While first-impression spaces and common areas should have more of a hospitality feel, neighborhoods and households should transition to a more residential feel. We want the spaces to say, "hospitality," but not to feel like a hotel. Our charge is to find that balance.

When it comes to the renovation of Heritage Community, Perkins Eastman has done its homework. "When we begin a project," says Jen, "we do initial research, really looking at the environment and culture surrounding the site." Noting that Kalamazoo is an industrial town with a history of being home to many factories—for windmills, mandolins, automobiles, and paper products, for example—the design team is taking an industrial-influenced design approach. "It's not too heavily industrial," says Jen, "as we want it to be comfortable and residential. So, the design is headed for industrial, modern infusion, incorporating warm wood tones, bronze and blackened metals, and hints of diffused factory glass."

Once the renovation is complete, the main dining room will be reminiscent of the classic Midwest supper club and feature a glass sculpture sourced from a local artisan. The refurbished wellness center will boast the latest in high-tech exercise equipment, as well as spaces where residents can exercise, participate in small-group classes, attend mindfulness and meditation courses, and work with a personal trainer and wellness coordinator to create customized wellbeing experiences.

With seven one- and two-bedroom floor plans, each including a complete kitchen with a full appliance package, Our Inner Circle members have plenty of options. Plus, as residences become available, they are refurbished with modern design finishes and comforts. And, depending on the availability of materials, some customizations are offered at a cost to the new resident.

In the end, the design of Heritage Community is informed by the residents and future residents. "We believe the aesthetic of Heritage Community will speak to the next generation in senior living," says Jay Prince, president and CEO of Heritage Community. "It sets a new bar for independent living in Southwest Michigan."



### Heritage Community SPOTLIGHT

MEET WYNDHAM RESIDENT DON KNEEPKENS



### Heritage Community Resident & Resident Board Member

As a resident of Heritage Community's Wyndham, Don Kneepkens is enjoying his independence.

He was born and raised in the Green Bay, Wisconsin area and fell in love with a beautiful girl, Jean, who attended a local rival high school. After graduating from high school, Don took the naval officer entrance exam and was subsequently awarded a full college scholarship with the stipulation that, for the next four years, he would take an hour of naval science class five days a week and put in nine weeks of active duty on a ship every summer.

Four years later, Don graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Madison with a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemistry/Chemical Engineering. And really, this is where the fun began. He graduated on a Friday evening in a ceremony at Camp Randall Stadium and was commissioned an officer into the U.S. Navy upon receiving his diploma. The very next day, Saturday, he married his sweetheart and had the chance of a lifetime to begin work the following Monday (the beginning of his honeymoon) at Kimberly-Clark Corporation. He put in 40 hours at Kimberly-Clark that first week before taking leave to embark on three-and-a-half years of active duty as a naval officer. During that time, he served on three different naval vessels and worked in naval intelligence.

"What was very unusual was that, upon returning from my service in the Navy, I was reinstated at Kimberly-Clark with three-and-a-half years of seniority," recalls Don. "My life was charmed back then."

During his 27 years at Kimberly-Clark, Don worked within many facets of the paper company. He was involved in central research, process engineering, and was a corporate officer for the last 10 years of his career, holding the title of Vice President/General Manager of three different divisions.

Don and his high school sweetheart had a large family of five boys and one girl, all born within 10 years. He never really took to golf because he was traveling so much, but he loved watching his kids play ball and being part of their activities. "We had three kids in high school and three kids in college—forever," laughs Don. "Those were wonderful days." He also recalls some of his favorite memories volunteering with the Catholic food banks, as well as using his knowledge as an Eagle Scout to work with the Boy Scouts.

With their children grown and Don and Jean starting lives of their own, Don began the next chapter of his professional life. They moved to the Los Angeles area where he went into business with a partner for 10 years in the specialty paper business. These highly specialized papers were used in drafting and architecture.

Upon Don retiring, the couple moved to Northern California in the foothills of the Sierra Nevada Mountains, where they lived for 16 years and loved every minute of it.

As Jean's health began declining, though, the couple decided to move to Michigan, and they relocated to Kalamazoo, where one of their sons lives. "We lived in a beautiful condo with lovely gardens," says Don. Sadly, his beloved Jean passed away nearly 11 years ago. However, Don celebrates the time they had together. "We were married for 56 wonderful years," he says.

Looking to downsize into a comfortable new home, Don chose a Life Plan Community—specifically, Heritage Community of Kalamazoo. "Heritage is a nonprofit, which is very important to me," he says. "Financially, they are strong, and you want to know that what you are investing in for your future will be around for the long term. The facilities and staff are very welcoming, and you feel good here."

For the last several years, Don has been on the Heritage Community Board of Directors serving as the Resident Board Member. In that role, he submits input from other residents, including important questions and concerns. As both a board member and a resident, he has a special and valuable perspective to offer. "In my mind, Heritage Community is very well run," he says. "Management has remained stable, and that says a lot."

Don says he has been blessed with good health and still truly lives a life of independence at Heritage. "There are so many activities here—three or four a week—with a lovely library and dining if you are interested," says Don. "In addition to those things, what I most value is maintaining my current level of independence. I can do anything I want, when I want, but if I need assistance, it is there for me." That sentiment is central to living in a Life Plan Community: Hopefully, you will never need the continuum of care, but it's there if you ever do.
